Project Details

- Located in the remote tribal village of Hemelkasa, Gadchiroli district, Mahrastra State, India
- Started by social reformer Baba Amte and his son Prakash Amte as a part of bringing the tribes of this remote village to mainstream education, health facilities.
- Established schools for upto 12th board level education, boarding and lodging and medical facilities fully free for the locality.
- Strength about 650 students, 14 aided teachers, 6 non aided teachers/volunteers.

Asha Zurich Contributions

 Provide boarding, lodging and educational expanses for 100 students (1500 Rs/- per month)

 Salary for two teachers (7000 Rs/- per month for each teacher)

• In terms of money sent — 16,56,000 Rs (about 24,500 CHF)

Federation's state level competition was held in Pune Balewadi.
 Following are few achievements:-

Kajal won Gold medal-long, Shivaji won silver medal - 800mtrs, Shewanti won silver medal - pole vault, Saguna won Bronze medal javelin throw.



Summer Camp (13th and 14th April) :- Blue Whale Nature Association Thane organized summer camp for LBP students. Camp contained some adventurous sports like climbing, crawling and night sky watching.







Tree Plantation:- Students of 11th standard organized tree plantation in Hemalkasa village. Villagers of Hemalkasa also participated in plantation program. Students also learn making of saplings.





World Tribal Day Celebration (9th August 2017) :- Students learned about constitutional rights of tribal peoples in India. Also tree plantation programme was organized. Street plays were presented on the dangers of Surjagad Mines.

- Science exhibition, street play workshop and different summer camps provide students opportunities for overall personality development

A scholarship for selected students taking part and doing well in different sport competitions can be taken up this year.








BOYS TOWN SOCIETY

Project background: Support of school initiated in 2014

- Thirumangalam village in Tamil Nadu
- Founded in 1965 by Joe Homan to educate and empower street children
- 5 Boys Towns, 1 Girls Town and 2 Children villages (residential homes) can accommodate up to 480 children
- End of year: BTS is assisting 401 children under residential care and another 296 children under non-residential care in a primary school
- Non-residential program in four villages covering 300 children who stay with their parents and attend evening program from 5 to 8.30 pm
- 11,141,37 INR in September 2017 approved towards running of school



Academic achievements

- Academic year 2016-17:
 - 100% success rate in 10th Standard examination (57 pupils)
 - 66.6% success rate in the 12th Standard examination (3 students)
- Besides academic achievement, a lot of other activities were initiated this quarter by the onsite team to ensure the social, physical and extracurricular development of the children




Vishvamandal sevashram (VMS): 'Palas'

Who, What, When and Where



- Who are 'they': Vishvamandal Sevashram (VMS) run by Jesuit Missionary supporting the tribal area for last 60 years
- What is their aim: Education of the children (primarily from the Bhil tribe in Dhule,
 Shirpur, Maharashtra)
- Since When have they been involved: Since 2005, Asha has been collaborating with VMS making it the oldest project running for 12 years, +800 kids, 35 classes covering +30 villages, +30 teachers, 3 supervisors
- Where are the 'schools': Informal schools are conducted in houses of villages (Padas) where formal schools do not exist or not functional. They are located in rural border of Maharashtra, Madya Pradesh & Gujarat (Mountain area)

The journey so far...



- In the last 12 years , +5000 kids have been benifited from Asha's support
- Schools functions in approx 35 villages(Padas) with limited infrastructure in context
 of road transport and electricity
- 35 students including 12 girls are supported with boarding facility to achieve their dream of completing 10th grade in government school
- Strong partnership with government to organize admission from Palas to mainstream government school starting 5th grade
- Successful integration with villagers imbibing importance of education, Villagers
 provide their houses for conducting classes reflecting commitment towards the cause
- Annual site visits by Asha Volunteers including project co-ordinator had positive impact on students and VMS Management

Achievements...



- Longest & the largest serving project in the region supporting approx. +800 students annually, Average annual costs per child only CHF 30
- Success stories : Nurse, Teacher, Computer professional, Graduates
- 3 Supervisors in charge of ensuring smooth operation of classes have been with the project for more than 10 years, Many teachers are ex-students of Palas reflecting commitment towards Asha/VMS initiative
- The initiative has brought change in the mindset of tribal population and are now happy to send kids for schools & boarding
- Identification of villages without formal schools in consultation with head of Village and starting "Palas"
- Teachers & Suervisor's training: Computer skills, English Literature, teaching skills etc

Challenges...



- Finding teachers & Supervisors; Drop out of students during harvest time
- Training teachers who themselves are only 8th/10th grade pass outs
- Access to location on mountains without no roads & Electricity
- Salaries of Teachers & Supervisors are too low for them to make living out of teaching, constant change of teachers impacts operation of school






Income Distribution




Split of Events




Project Disbursement



The above table represents a consolidation of fund raising and disbursements in 2017. The funds raised increased from CHF 57,397 in 2016 to CHF 85,880 in 2017. The allocation from Global Funds were significantly higher in 2017 and Asha Zurich received 182,917 USD (vs CHF 64,219 in 2016). The WAH campaign in 2017 for the Lok Biradri Prakalp raised 8,475 USD. This added to total receipts of CHF 277,272 which is an increase of approx. 127% compared to the total receipts of 2016 (CHF 121,616). The allocation of global funds is dependent on the utilization ratio; only chapters with a ratio below 1.5 (balances / average annual disbursement amount of last two years) qualify to receive a share of the global funds.

Disbursements amounted to CHF 123,017 (vs CHF101,948 in 2016). A new project, Nayantara, in West Bengal was adopted this year. There was also a one-time donation in coalition with Asha Chicago to Gramya Sansthan, Uttar Pradesh, to aid the construction of science laboratories and library.

The funds utilized for disbursements originated from our Swiss accounts and from the US accounts. However, the US accounts were given priority after the huge share from Global Funds were received.

The closing balance amounts to CHF 241,895 (vs CHF 100,933 in 2016). The Swiss accounts contain CHF 139,285. The remaining amount is present in the US account of Asha Zurich and is under complete control of Global Asha Team. However, with the total amount of CHF 241,895, funding can be covered for 2 years.

The net income acquired in 2017 continued its upwards trend and summed up to CHF 263,979 (vs CHF 116,897 in 2016). More than half of this (69%) is accounted for by the contribution from the global Asha Treasury pool.


General and purpose bound one-time donations excluding the funds allocated by the global Asha Treasury pool slightly rose to CHF 15,758 (vs. CHF 14,795 in 2015). Funds received from regular donors through our Charity as Your Hobby (CAYH) program increased to CHF 8,705 in 2017 compared to CHF 8,285 in 2016. The Zurich Marathon, which is traditionally the largest fundraiser, raised CHF 42,419 (vs. CHF 26,831 in 2016)

The Bollywood Event organized in 2017 raised an amount of CHF 4009, however, the expenses for this event have raised due to the high rental charges

of the Venue. Therefore, the net profit was CHF 937 and was considerably lower than the previous Bollywood events.


Asha Zurich was part of Google's Giving week in 2017. The funds from Google's Giving week in 2016 was received in early 2017 and it amounted to CHF 14,731.

CHARITY AS YOUR HOBBY (CAYH) AT A GLANCE



CAYH is a program initiated by Asha Zurich in 2002. Donors participating in this contribute a fixed amount periodically, usually monthly. This ensures a constant inflow of funds and helps us to make our annual budget. CAYH donations raised slightly in comparison to previous year. A CAYH team is now formed to focus on mainstreaming this source of revenue for self-sustainability.


DONATIONS AT A GLANCE



The amount of one time donations increased slightly to CHF 15,728 in 2017 from CHF 14,795 in 2016. A Christmas drive was initiated in 2017 at the end of the year, where mails were sent to donors and a decent amount of CHF 3,230 was raised from this initiative.


In 2015, a one-time donation was done for the Chennai flood relief. Since there were some non-utilized funds, the recipient will be donating this amount, CHF 2,151, back to Asha Zurich.

PROJECT DISBURSEMENTS AT A GLANCE



Asha Zurich again adopted a new project in 2017, Nayantara in West Bengal and continued the one-time purpose bound disbursements for Gramya Sansthan, U.P school.

The chart below shows the total disbursement shares of various projects. Since, the project Naba Diganta and Natun Aloo have their funding year from July-June, a funding for the first half of 2017 was sent amounting to half the budget and then in second half of 2017 disbursed the entire budget to fund the schools from July-2017 to June-2018. A one-time donation in addition to the regular funding of Palas was done, in order to aid uniforms for the students and setting up of portable lamps in the school's infrastructure. The school Nayantara has also been funded for the entire year, i.e. from July-2017 to June-2018.



CONCLUSION

The financial year 2017 was another very stable and positive year. Overall fund receipts increased mainly due to a larger allocation of US funds, donations and CAYH receipts increased slightly and disbursements increased by 20%.
